

North Region

1. Fida Shafee – Nablus:

The mosaic art workshop in Nablus's Old City welcomes visitors interested in this craft and gives them the opportunity to create a mosaic artwork to take home as a souvenir of Nablus. To promote the presence of the arts in our lives, safeguard our cultural heritage, and contribute to the development of community-based and craft-based tourism in the field of mosaics.

2. Sohaip Samara Palestine on Bike – Nablus:

Waymarking the biking segment on PH trail - Marking the cycle route along the Palestine Heritage Trail: 8 sections from Jenin to Hebron.

3. Rumanna Club – Jenin:

Development of a Rest Area - public park.

4. Hamayel garden – Nablus:

Public Park.

5. Makhdob Kitchen – Ramallah:

Development of a kitchen and Rest area to provide work for local workers, and to provide local meals for the visitors of the trail.

6. Ghadeer Hamadeen – Jericho:

Bedouin Tent – Providing accommodation, organizing trips, and offering traditional cuisine.

7. Nada Iseed – Jericho:

To provide tourists with a distinctive and varied travel experience as part of the Palestine tourism itinerary.

To create a venue in Jericho that offers tourists a unique service and experience—one that is currently unavailable or limited—where they can truly immerse themselves in the experience rather than merely staying overnight; a place where they spend time with a Palestinian family, interact with them, eat together, and learn or observe cooking methods, This takes place in the home environment, and additional services are provided to help them explore the city and get to know the local community, such as bicycle hire and the provision of necessary information, as well as equipment for walking trails. A space will also be set aside for the sale of local produce, such as dates, bananas and citrus fruits, as well as souvenirs related to the city.

8. Ahmed Najoom – Jericho:

Bedouin Tent – Providing accommodation and offering traditional cuisine. Storytelling.

9. Ezz Al-Din Ka'abneh – Jericho:

Camping: new tourism activity along the trail which is camping in some of the attractive spots on the trail.

10. Ayat Mardawe – Jenin:

Guest house Providing accommodation and offering traditional cuisine.

11. Nihal Duwabsha – Nablus:

Guest house Providing accommodation and offering traditional cuisine.

12. Shadi Basir – Ramallah (Taybeh):

Classical old village style building into a guest house to host visitors on the Taybeh section of the trail.
Guest house Providing accommodation and offering traditional cuisine.

13. Areej Haji – Nablus:

Guest house Providing accommodation and offering traditional cuisine.

14. Ashraf Al-Sha'ar – Nablus (Sebastia):

Tourism Platform (Launch of a tourism website and mobile app to promote archaeological, tourist and heritage sites in the Sebastia region, as well as events and activities. The website and app aim to promote tourism and engage with the private sector and community initiatives to revitalize the tourism industry in the region.

15. Al Qamar Association – Jericho:

Through this grant, the association aims to develop a new cycling trail within the city of Jericho, in collaboration with the municipality. The project will also enhance the association's existing bicycle rental service and organize eco-friendly, recreational cycling tours, offering a sustainable way for visitors to explore Jericho's natural beauty and rich historical landmarks.

In addition, the project includes training local tour guides in guiding techniques and group leadership skills. This will create new employment opportunities while enriching the overall visitor experience in an active, inclusive, and environmentally conscious manner.

16. Pal Vision – Ramallah:

The initiative will establish a dedicated e-bike tourism trail connecting villages in the northwest Jerusalem area, aligned with the "Palestinian Heritage Trail." It offers visitors a unique experience to discover local culture, engage with communities, and enjoy the natural beauty of the region. The project also includes training local youth to manage and guide tours along the trail—creating job opportunities and contributing to local economic development.

17. Al Nasher – Ramallah:

In cooperation with the Ramallah Municipality, this project launches an interactive digital guide for the Ramallah Tourist Trail, offering rich multimedia content—including maps, images, audio, and text—that introduces visitors to the city's historical, cultural, and natural landmarks. The initiative is complemented by a specialized training and capacity-building program designed to equip local tour guides with essential skills in guiding techniques, communication, and cultural interpretation. The goal is to enhance the overall quality of the visitor experience while fostering sustainable employment opportunities within the local community.

18. Fuad Muaddi – Ramallah:

Arriyya is an eco-luxury glamping initiative that offers guests a unique opportunity to experience sustainable living by reconnecting with nature and using responsible, eco-friendly resources—all while maintaining comfort and simplicity.

19. Jinai Company – Jenin:

Palestinian women-led marketing company aims to expand its operations to include the production and sale of handcrafted embroidered badges and natural straw baskets, reflecting authentic Palestinian cultural identity. These products will be marketed and sold through the company's own marketing network, utilizing digital platforms and direct sales channels, with a focus on both local and international markets that value handmade and heritage items. This expansion seeks to empower women artisans, preserve Palestinian crafts, and create sustainable job opportunities within the community.

20. Umniah Center – Jenin:

The project aims to produce a short, engaging, and educational film that narrates the story of the ancient town of Arraba across different historical periods. Using a mix of compelling storytelling, visual effects, and dramatization, the film will serve as a cultural and educational tool for visitors. The project also includes setting up a dedicated screening room at the Interpretation Center in Arraba, equipped with appropriate technology to showcase the film regularly as part of the visitor experience.

21. Ahmad Kiwan – Nablus (Sebastia):

An open-air Palestinian heritage kitchen will be developed within Dar Tarbush, dedicated to offering interactive Palestinian culinary experiences based on traditional cuisine and local ingredients. The kitchen will provide services through the preparation of heritage meals, the organization of educational workshops on cooking and food production, as well as cultural hospitality experiences that reflect Palestinian identity. The project also aims to provide visitors with a holistic experience combining food, heritage sites and cultural storytelling, thereby promoting cultural and community-based tourism and encouraging the participation of the local community – particularly women – in economic and creative activities.

22. Junet Elafeya – Nablus:

Juna Al-Afia is an agricultural, educational, cultural and tourist complex located in the village of Jorish, east of Nablus (opposite the village of Aqraba), covering 15 dunums of cultivated land. The site includes accommodation. Accommodation and eco-agricultural and cultural tourism services will be developed at Juna Al-Afia, alongside the development of local agricultural products through improvements to the reception facilities, upgrading of infrastructure, and the establishment of processing and packaging facilities for agricultural products to ensure their quality and sustainability. This includes providing accommodation and catering services, organizing agricultural, educational and cultural activities, and eco-tourism tours, as well as the sale of processed and fresh local agricultural products.

23. Yalo Association for Studies and Development – Nablus:

The project aims to develop an innovative range of artistic products inspired by Palestinian heritage, crafted by the skilled hands of female small-scale entrepreneurs, following specialized training in various handicrafts such as rural embroidery, waxwork, glass painting, straw craft, handmade accessories and resin. In keeping with the spirit and concept of the project, the products created by these women will feature an authentic artistic style that reflects Palestinian cultural identity, drawing inspiration from heritage and the symbolism of historical landmarks and sites. These works will be displayed at key locations within the Nablus Governorate, which attracts large numbers of local visitors and foreign tourists. This initiative aims to enhance the presence of Palestinian heritage in public spaces and open new marketing opportunities for craftswomen, ensuring their sustainable economic empowerment and increased income, whilst raising awareness of Palestinian culture through creative products of an artistic and authentic nature.

24. Mini Palestine Park – Jenin:

Handcraft: Tourism and cultural learning park that showcases miniature models of Palestine's historical landmarks, providing visitors with an innovative and immersive learning experience. The park creates detailed replicas of key historical sites in Palestine, allowing visitors to explore and connect with the country's rich heritage in a unique and engaging way.

25. Ecobee – Jenin:

Eco-Rural Tourism Initiative: A sustainable agriculture and beekeeping experience where visitors participate in farm and apiary activities, learn about nectar plants, observe honey production, explore traditional Palestinian beekeeping practices, and immerse themselves in rural life.

26. Jenin Center for Culture and Creativity – Jenin:

Establishing a Pottery Workshop - The project involves establishing a pottery and ceramics workshop in Burqin village, located along the PHT, with the goal of reviving traditional crafts, stimulating local tourism, and providing youth with training in pottery and ceramics production techniques.

27. kazdora w fakhora – Jenin:

Pottery and ceramics tourism experience in Arraba, where visitors create artifacts, apply glazes, and take their creations home as souvenirs. The project also includes guided tours and school/youth engagement programs to promote cultural learning and craftsmanship.

28. Wild Plant Nursery Project – Jenin:

Agritourism: Nursery producing ornamental seedlings and dwarf trees from native wild plants, aimed at supporting conservation efforts, raising environmental awareness, and promoting eco-tourism.

29. Feather and Colour – Jenin:

Handicraft: A ceramics production initiative in Jenin specializing in heritage-inspired agricultural pots and household ceramics with modern eco-friendly packaging and year-round product availability.

30. The Scent of Letters – Jenin:

Handcraft: A cultural tourism experience reviving Arabic calligraphy through live demonstrations and producing wooden/mosaic heritage pieces for visitors.

31. 3D Watan – Jenin:

Handcraft: This initiative transforms harmful plastic waste into valuable 3D printing filament, effectively addressing environmental challenges while promoting sustainable manufacturing practices and supporting multiple industries, including tourism. The filament is further used to produce finished items such as models, keychains, crosses, and other souvenirs, which are sold to visitors. This approach not only generates additional income but also encourages the creation and use of environmentally friendly products.

32. Baraa handmade – Jenin:

Handcraft: A handcrafted product venture producing creative furniture, décor, and children's craft boxes, marketed along the PHT.

33. Moon City Farm – Jericho:

Moon City Farm – Agricultural Tourism Project: Combines greenhouse vegetable farming, grape, citrus, and ornamental tree cultivation, and beekeeping. Visitors can harvest vegetables and fish in the pond, taste local products, cook traditional meals, and participate in beeswax-based product workshops.

34. Tools and Needs of Trail Members – Nablus:

A support initiative equipping trail members with essential tools and supplies to improve visitor experience and safety along the PHTRAIL.

35. Reviving Palestinian Heritage – Nablus:

Women-led handicrafts: Heritage-based project supporting women-led handicrafts through a digital platform and exhibitions, enabling regional and global marketing via e-commerce and social media.

36. Lana Hand Craft – Nablus:

Handcraft: A creative handicraft project producing wall art and décor using canvas fabric, embroidery threads, plaster, and paste.

37. Belado – Nablus:

Handcraft: A souvenir design project producing modern tourism products (magnets, mugs, eco-bags, postcards, etc.) representing heritage trail cities and villages.

38. Daliyat al-Karmel Environmental Farm – Nablus:

Agritourism: A project combining traditional farming, hydroponics, and compost production with educational visits, aimed at promoting sustainable agriculture while empowering women and youth.

39. Tour Palestine – Nablus:

Digital interactive platform designed to address the lack of authentic cultural guidance for Palestinian cities, promoting heritage through curated tourism content.

40. Ceramics and Pottery Education and Production – Nablus:

Handcraft: A Training and production center located in a restored traditional house in Bayt Wazan (Nablus), providing visitors with opportunities to learn crafts and participate in production activities.

41. Flowers Land – Jenin:

Flowers Land is a model eco-farm that converts treated wastewater into high-quality roses, packaged in an eco-friendly manner. The farm offers visitors the opportunity to pick unique roses and create customized gifts, promoting sustainability, environmental awareness, and tourism in the area.

42. PalVision – Ramallah:

Tourism platform A virtual reality heritage tourism platform using AI/IoT and historical guide characters to enable safe exploration of Palestinian landmarks globally.

43. From stone – Ramallah:

Handcraft: A jewelry brand transforming Palestinian stones into wearable pieces that convey heritage and national narrative globally.

44. Handmade Heritage Crafts Project – Jericho:

Handcraft: The project focuses on traditional handmade crafts, including embroidery, beading, wax work, and the use of resin and gypsum. Its primary goal is to promote Palestinian heritage in Jericho, a UNESCO World Heritage site, and attract tourists seeking authentic cultural experiences.

45. Moon Photo – Jericho:

Handcraft: The business offers a unique way for customers to preserve their cherished memories using personal photos or images representing Palestinian heritage. Visitors can bring their own photos or choose from ready-made images, then select their preferred format, such as keychains, photo cards, or magnets. This service provides an innovative and tangible way to immortalize special moments while celebrating Palestinian culture.
